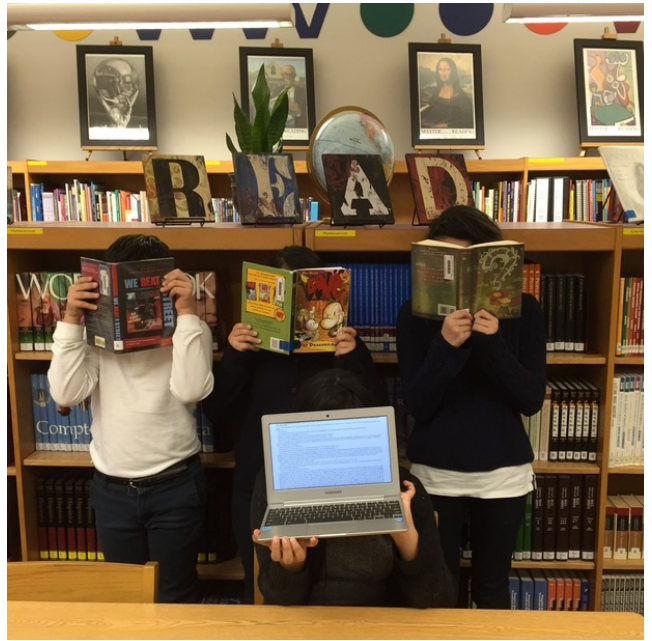

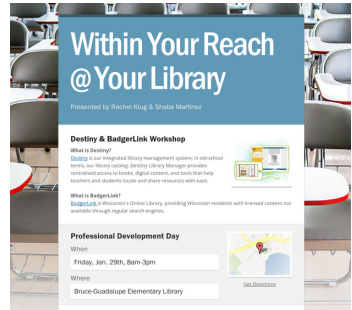

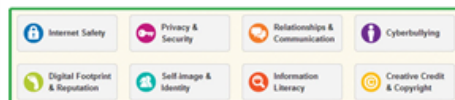

The courses can be accessed for free by the instructors, who are then able to monitor the students' progress. Digital passport lessons are presented as games that reward progress with badges. Students access their accounts via Destiny.
